


LEX GJURASIC IS A SELF-REALIZED ARTIST ORIGINALLY FROM THE RAIN-SOAKED PACIFIC NORTHWEST, NOW LIVING AND WORKING IN TUCSON, AZ. SHE HAS EXHIBITED HER WORK NATIONALLY FOR OVER 20 YEARS, MOST NOTABLY IN 2009 AT THE JAPANESE AMERICAN NATIONAL MUSEUM IN LOS ANGELES, CA, AS A FEATURED ARTIST IN THE EXHIBITION KOKESHI: FOLK ART TO ART TOY. GJURASIC ALSO WRITES ABOUT HER EXPERIENCE OF BEING AN ARTIST ON HER BLOG.



OTHERWORLDLY IS A NEW SERIES OF PAINTINGS INSPIRED BY CACTI, CLOUDS, FUNGI AND SEA LIFE. PULLING FROM EVERY PLANE OF EXISTENCE, INCLUDING THE COSMIC, OTHERWORLDLY IS THE NEXT LEVEL OF MY WORK, WHICH CONTINUES TO DRAW INSPIRATION FROM NATURAL FORMS. THESE LEVITATING PAINTINGS, WHICH ARE PAINTED ON WOOD AND MOUNTED IN A WAY TO CAST A SCULPTURAL SHADOW, EVOKE POP AND GRAFFITI MOVEMENTS AS WELL AS CARTOON AND JAPANESE KAWAII CULTURE, BLENDING MY URBAN DESERT EXPERIENCE IN A DYNAMIC AND UNEXPECTED WAY.








THE STRANGE AND UNIQUE FLORA OF THE SONORAN DESERT IS REDUCED TO ESSENTIAL FORMS AND PATTERNS AWAKING A SENSE OF THE UNSEEN WORLD. WORK INCLUDES ABSTRACTED PRICKLY PEARS, BEAVER TAILS AND SAGUARO CACTI AS THEY BECOME LIBERATE SYMBOLS OF BIRTH, LIFE, DEATH AND REBIRTH.















CRYSTAL SKULL WALL HANGINGS ARE COMPOSED OF WHOLE AND PULVERIZED CRYSTALS, FOUND OBJECTS AND GLASS GLITTER ON BONE. THESE PIECES STEM FROM MY ONGOING SERIES OF SCULPTURAL OBJECTS, NEWAGEFOLKLORE, IN WHICH I BLEND DISPARATE MATERIALS THAT IN COMBINATION THEN BECOME POTENT VISIONARY TALISMAN OF THE COSMIC HUMAN EXPERIENCE. CRYSTAL SKULLS ARE DIRECTLY INSPIRED BY CRYSTAL ENERGIES, THE VIBRATIONAL QUALITY OF COLOR AND THE ACT OF COLLECTING. THROUGH MY SCULPTURAL OBJECTS I HOPE TO GIFT THE OBSERVER WITH AN ELEVATED SENSE OF THE UNSEEN WORLD.











I SEEK OUT CRESTED (OR CRISTATE) SAGUAROS IN THE LANDSCAPE VIA OFF-ROADING & HIKING, THEN CAPTURE THEM IN PHOTOS & SKETCHES THAT BECOME PAINTINGS IN MY STUDIO. THROUGH MY PROCESS, EACH PAINTING THEN BECOMES A POWERFUL & HALLUCINATORY PORTRAIT THAT CAPTURES THE PECULIAR PERSONALITY OF EACH INDIVID-UAL CRESTED SAGUARO. THOUGH SOME MAY SEE A CRESTED SAGUARO AS A MONSTROSITY, I SEE THESE RARE ASYMMET-RICAL FORMS AS DIVINE. CRESTED SAGUAROS ARE FORMED WHEN CELLS IN THE STEM OF THE CACTUS MUTATE & BEGIN TO DIVIDE OUTWARD GROWING IN BOTH UNEXPECTED & UN-USUAL WAYS. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT 1 IN EVERY 200,000 SAGUAROS IS A CRISTATE.









IN MY SERIES FLOWER FIELDS I EXPLORE MY AFFINITY FOR FAKE FLOWERS. THESE PAINTINGS GROW OUT OF THE TRADITION ROOTED IN THE DEEP SOUTH OF THE UNITED STATES OF PLACING SILK OR PLASTIC FLOWERS AT GRAVESIDE. FROM THESE SYMBOLS OF DEVOTION AND REMEMBRANCE I WAS INSPIRED TO PAINT VAST AND UNENDING FIELDS OF FLOWERS. I WAS ATTRACTED TO THE IDEA OF GIVING THOSE WHO HAVE PASSED A GIFT THAT WILL NEVER WILL OR DIE.











MY EVER-CHANGING ARRAY OF GOODS INSPIRED BY MY ARTWORK ARE AVAILABLE FOR WHOLESALE OR RETAIL PURCHASE. THESE PLAYFUL OBJECTS ARE MADE BY CREATING A MOLD FROM A NATURAL OBJECT (SUCH AS CACTUS PADDLES, OR CRYSTALS) AND THEN MAKING A PLASTER CAST. THE OBJECT IS THEN INDIVIDUALLY PAINTED AND GLAZED. MY UNUSUAL WEARABLE ART PIECES TO ADORN THE BODY OR AS A HANGING DECORATIVE ELEMENT IN A ENVIRONMENT MAKE A BOLD STATEMENT. THESE ARE MADE FROM COLLECTED DETRITUS SUCH AS COCOONS, BONE, TEETH AND OTHER FOUND OBJECTS THAT CATCH MY EYE WHILE OUT WANDERING THE DESERT. OF COURSE, I HAVE MY SIGNATURE KOKESHI NESTING DOLLS ALWAYS AVAILABLE IN SETS OF 5 HAND PAINTED WOODEN DOLLS. ALL THESE ITEMS FIT QUITE NICELY IN ANY HOME, BOUTIQUE, INTERIOR DESIGN STUDIO OR MUSEUM STORE. SELECTED ART AND COMMISSIONS ARE AVAILABLE FOR LICENSING.
